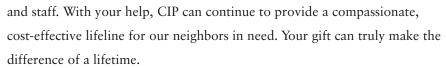

Providing for the Needs of our Community

The health and well-being of any community depends on its ability to provide for the many needs of its constituents. CIP is proud to play a key role in the continuum of care for our vibrant community. Through our sliding scale services and our longstanding partnerships with other service providers, we maintain a vital safety-net for Marin's most vulnerable.

From our founding in 1977, CIP has worked to assure access to timely, quality mental health services for families, children and adults in need, regardless of income. Our work has never been more important than it is today.

Last year, CIP delivered to the Marin community . . .

- Over 8,000 hours of mental health services to more than 750 families, children and adults, 63% of whom had monthly household incomes under \$1,200, and 32% incomes between \$1,200 and \$3,500; more than 95% did not have Medi-Cal.
- More than 1,660 hours of counseling through our Schools Project, serving approximately 100 low-income elementary, middle- and high-school students to help them overcome emotional problems and succeed in school.
- Early intervention through our new Healthy Teen Therapy Groups for at-risk middle-school students to foster resilience, emotional stability, and social skills.
- More than 1,400 hours of counseling for clients of the Ritter Center, Helen Vine Detox Center, Canal Alliance, and Senior Access, delivered onsite at their facilities to assure greatest access to needed care.

We continued our outstanding training and professional development, providing . . .

- Approximately 360 hours of special training and more than 2,900 hours of individual and group supervision for 24 intern-therapists by more than 100 licensed mental health professionals who volunteered their time and expertise, an in-kind donation of more than \$350,000.
- Three day-long seminars and seven classes by leading clinicians through our successful Professional Development Program for Bay Area professionals, thus assuring an informed and committed professional community.

CIP operated with outstanding cost efficiency:

- Fully 84% of the agency's \$605,000 budget goes toward direct services, while administrative costs are 12%, and fund raising expenses just 4%.
- More than one-third (37%) of CIP programs are provided on a pro bono basis to vulnerable populations through our collaborating partners; all other services are available on a sliding scale.

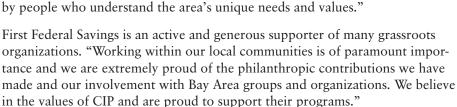
